VMTA Fall Festival 2017

Saturday, November 4, 2017 St. Catherine's School, Guigon Music Building 6001 Grove Avenue, 23226

Spark your students' enthusiasm early and join us for this fall performance opportunity. This event is non-competitive, designed to encourage the playing of varied styles of music and build the students' confidence as performers. Two memorized pieces are required – one traditional and one contemporary. Guidelines, teacher responsibility forms, and entry forms can be found in the RMTA yearbook. The fee is \$12.00 per student, and teacher's checks are payable to RMTA.

Just a few notes:

1. When completing the application for your students, please indicate if they need a morning time or afternoon time. Once the schedules are mailed to the teachers, it is preferable to have no requests for changes. If a conflict does arise and you must change a student's time, please let the chairmen know by Oct. 30th.

2. Have students bring their music for the judges. It is helpful to have a measure number at the beginning of each system. Music will be returned to the students after they play. Please do not bring photocopied music to Fall Festival unless you have obtained permission. Teachers and students must abide by the federal Copyright Law.

3. The usual venue at U of R is under renovation this fall, so we are holding the Fall Festival in the music building at St. Catherine's School. Maps of the campus will be sent to teachers, and we will have signs posted to direct everyone to the music building.

Many helpers are needed in order to have a successful Fall Festival. We hope you will volunteer to support your local association. If you have questions, please contact the chairmen.
