VMTA Theory Tests

The VMTA Theory Tests for RMTA were held on March 11, 2017 at VCU. Our system of sharing the workshop continues to work successfully. Jennifer Scott and Wesley Pollard co-chaired the event. A report was sent to the new state theory chair of VMTA, Gianne Zhu, on March 21st by Gabriella Ryan. We had 19 RMTA teachers participate with 141 students (9 additional theory entries compared to last year). The fees collected amounted to \$1,692. Students took tests ranging from Primer to Level 12. There were 9 that did not pass. 107 of the total students received Superior, Excellent, or Very Good. Congratulations to the students and their teachers on these great accomplishments.
